Fear thou not; for I [am] with thee: be not dismayed; for I [am] thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness" (Isaiah 41:10).

"Fear not," God says to us. And yet we fear. "Be not dismayed." And yet we worry and become anxious over many things, like Pastor Dave leaving Hope for greater things. God continually tells us "I am with you," yet we continue to become panic stricken by the cares of this life, what's happening in church and not realizing just how close He really is. Our eyes are so often focused on our problems that surround us we cannot see the God who remains with us. That is the God that sends His Holy Spirit to guide us along the way. God is near.

So why do we act like He has forgotten about Hope Church? That is not so, God has a reason for all things that happen in this world and especially at Hope Church. If we go into panic mode then we give Satan more and more attention, and we give him more and more power. We eventually give him more power in our lives than God, as we let our panic and fears control what we think and what we must do going forward.

Perhaps the reason God seems so far off is because we have become complacent and inattentive. Some people had questions about last week's devotion. I was not taking cheap shots at Pastor Dave. Some of the time I write about my fears and inadequacies, I sometimes feel as though I have let down the people at Hope because I have not done enough. Pastor Dave did not know all the people of Hope Church when he arrived here and I wonder if I did enough to bring to his attention the needs of Hope. This sentence "Even the pulpit, in some cases, has taken the less involved role with the members", did not mean Pastor Dave but all the leadership of Hope Church and especially me. My goal as a council member is to be sensitive to the needs of the entire congregation.

Maybe we have gotten our eyes off of Him by putting all the wonderful things we want out of life above our devotion to our Heavenly Father. If we move away from the Light of God to chase after the world, we will only be filled with darkness, and cannot see a wonderful future ahead of us. I must have the light from God to see and plan ahead. "If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness! (Mt.6:25).

God is near. But if we are blinded by problems and not thinking of solutions or even considering what the future hold we become selfish and lose focus. We lose that closeness to God and isn't the love of God and Hope Church at the front of all our blessing? And if we can't see Him, in the midst of all the changes we are going through, how can we bring ourselves to trust Him? And if we can't bring ourselves to trust in Him, how can we learn to depend on Him when we are surrounded by troubles, or changes? How can we learn to have peace if the future is so uncertain?

The changes in our church can and will force most of us to reevaluate or vision for Hope Church and our role in the community. God has something to say to us about that. He says, "Do you feel weak? I will strengthen you. Do you need assistance? I'll be there--I will help you. Are you weary and feel like you cannot take another step? I will hold you up." These are not simply words but they are the promises from God. Would God lie to you? Of course not. Do you think He is talking to everyone but Hope Church? Of course He is talking to Hope Church--He is talking to all of us. We simply have to pray and to believe what God said He will do, He will do just that, He will fulfill all those promises. Like Pastor Dave said in the sermon, we must have faith like Abraham and we must follow the path in front of us even though we may not quite know where we are going. He is faithful to His word even when we are sometimes lacking faith.

He tells us to pray without ceasing. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

What is holding you back? Are your eyes glued on the changes that are happening or perhaps your fear is overwhelming your faith? "Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you" (James 4:8). "Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart" (Psalms 37:4). ". . .for He hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Hebrews 13:5). "Fear thou not; for I [am] with thee: be not dismayed; for I [am] thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness" (Isaiah 41:10).

We need wait upon the Lord; He alone will grant us the power of the Holy Spirit and the wisdom to make wise decisions. He has already put good and faithful Pastors in place to help us figure out what we need at this very moment, and how to plan for our future. This will also be of great benefit to us as we focus on where we want to be as a church and what type of Pastor will be the best fit for us.

The right answers will be there for us as long as we focus on what God's will is for Hope Church. Our individual wants and needs should take a last place in our efforts to make the future of Hope Church bright and purposeful. Yes, we all hate change, and let's face it; an uncertain future makes us worry. But if we bond together as a congregation we can overcome the doubts and fears Satan is trying to weigh upon us.

We all have a stake in our future and our vision for Hope Church, this means it will take the entire congregation from the youngest to the oldest and all in between to keep the faith going forward.

So let all of us pray unceasingly for the hope, future and vision of Hope Church. And pray for God's grace and peace as we start a new venture for Hope Church.

Our Mission project for March will be **Personal Care Kits.** Each kit includes:



- One light weight bath size towel—20"x40" to 27"x52" dark color recommended (Lightweight towels are recommended as often they are washed in a river or water hole and need to air dry. Often all family members use one towel.)
- Two bath size bars (4-5 oz) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult size toothbrush in original packaging
- One **sturdy** comb, remove packaging
- One metal nail clipper—remove packaging

You may bring in items for a kit and we will assemble it or if completing a kit, wrap all the items in the towel and tie securely with ribbon or yarn. Place items or completed kits in the tote near the coffee hour area. Shopping lists are on coffee counter. All items should be new and in good condition. These kits will be sent when natural disasters strike or political conflict flares and families often have to flee very suddenly with no chance to gather anything. Many are in refugee camps, scared, vulnerable and dirty from the travel. These simple items show them someone cares and is concerned for them in their plight. Last year Personal Care Kits were sent to Angola, Burkina Faso, Dem Rep, Conga, Georgia, Mali, Pakistan, Peru, Serbia, Tanzania and Ukraine. Total kits sent was 144,970
